END OF YEAR MESSAGE 2022

As at December 10, 2022 the total number of people who tested positive for COVID – 2019 in USA from 2020-2022 remained at 99.4 million people while a total number of deaths stood at 1,095,000. Globally 649million tested positive while a total fatalities of 6,652,000 was recorded from the inception of the pandemic, a figure that is likely higher than the population of the world wiped off by the deluge during Noah's time. COVID-19 was identified as the third leading cause of death in the United States, trailing only heart disease and cancer. Prudence and CDC caution on the need to continue masking and maintaining healthy distance, particularly during the coming holidays, as the Virus continues to wreck havoes sporadically all over the world.

Other Notable features of this year's disasters

- 1)The 29 global whether related disaster Drought damages of farm products and lands are already placed at \$38.4 billion globally and will surely continue to rise according to Insurance Broker Aon. 1.
- 2) Only three billion-dollar tropical cyclones have occurred in 2022: Hurricane Ian and Hurricane Fiona in the Atlantic, and Typhoon Nanmadol in the western Pacific. ...
- 3) Two weather mega-disasters costing over \$20 billion have hit Earth in 2022: Hurricane Ian in the U.S., and the European drought and heat wave. ...

Earthquakes: In 2022, there were **11** quakes of magnitude **7.0** or above, **121** quakes between **6.0** and **7.0**, **1651** quakes between **5.0** and **6.0**, **14697** quakes between **4.0** and 5.0. The Deadliest being 6.0 Mw Afghanistan, where 1,428 deaths were reported. The Lord is speaking through Nature, let us listen.

The 6th National Convention – The 2022 National Convention held at Crystal Gateway Marriott, Arlington Virginia/Washington DC, Maryland-Washington Region 'E' tagged "Transformation 2022" was yet another great landmark achievement for the diocese. Despite the unfortunate impasse in the diocese, this great convention held on May 5-8, 2022 attracted 504 attendees drawn from 51 parishes. During the convention the USA Central Choir provided an incredibly amazing and most spiritually transforming renditions of International standard while the youth also provided four well researched and articulated papers to transform the church. Seven thoroughly researched papers were presented and four were approved as Blue Prints for inclusion into the byelaws. The National Convention Board is currently on the drawing Board to finalize arrangement for the Venue and Strategies for the seventh Convention that will come up by God's grace in 2024.
